# **Today's Music Notes from Dan**

**Prelude:** Gospel arrangement of two spirituals. "Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen" is a song that originated during the period of North American slavery. Black scholar and sociologist W.E.B. DuBois (1868–1963) posed a question that is on the tips of the tongues of even well-meaning and compassionate people: "How does it feel to be a problem?" (DuBois, 1903, p. 15) This unasked, rhetorical question can only be answered in what he called "The Sorrow Songs" like this one. "All Night, All Day" possibly came from secret prayer meetings. Recalled a former slave, Wash Wilson: "Sometimes us sing and pray all night."

**Rock-a My Soul:** A traditional African American spiritual. It was first documented by William Francis Allen, in the 1867 collection *Slave Songs of the United States*. Allen attributed the origin of the song to Virginia.

This Little Light of Mine: The origin of this song is unclear, but the phrase "This little light of mine" appears published in poetry by 1925 by Edward Ivins, a writer in Montana. In 1933, the song was mentioned in newspapers as being sung by a chorus at an African Methodist Episcopal conference in Helena, Montana and then various other churches around the United States later that year. It refers to Jesus' words "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matt. 5:14–16.)

**Just a Closer Walk with Thee:** The precise author of this song is unknown. Circumstantial evidence strongly suggests it dates back to southern African American churches of the nineteenth century, possibly even prior to the Civil War, as some personal black histories recall "slaves singing as they worked in the fields a song about walking by the Lord's side."

**Postlude:** This work song originated among Caribbean black workers in the 19<sup>th</sup> century and is based on Jesus' parable about the wise man who built his house on rock and the foolish man who built his on sand (Matt. 7:24-27). It was both practical and spiritual at the same time. Workers would repeat the short two-measure phrases as many times as may be needed to complete a particular task, but maybe for hours.

Thornhill Presbyterian Church is pleased to announce the appointment of Daniel Werning as Director of Music Ministry effective immediately.

Dan is an accomplished organist, choir director, and educator. Among his degrees is a Masters of Church Music from Concordia Teacher's College, now Concordia University Chicago, a university of the

Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. Dan is a man of deep faith and happens to also be a Lutheran pastor.

As organist and choir director Dan has led the music ministries of a number of Lutheran and Episcopalian churches in the United States, including in Hawaii. There, Dan also initiated a community choir, Hawaii Sacred Choir.
