He's Got the Whole World in His Hands

As the title implies, this traditional African American spiritual is a reminder that God is in control of all aspects of his creation and we should take comfort in his presence. From the birds in the air and the fish in the sea to "little bitsy babies" and grown-up gamblin' men, everything is in his hands. Different versions add more to God's grasp, including the sun and the moon, the land and the sea, and the wind and the rain. God's mighty rulership is mentioned throughout the Bible, including Job 12:10, which states: "In his hand is the life of every living thing, and the breath of every human being." (Songfacts.com)

Do Lord Remember Me

Do Remember Me is an up-tempo workday song the enslaved meant to drive home the point that they were hurt and tired of not being acknowledged as human beings with dignity, pride and grace like everyone else. They were tired of being afraid, tired of the conditions forced upon them, and their saving grace was to use songs to speak to God. It is a chilling reminder of how damaging being enslaved is for the human soul and how vital it is to be free to tell your story. In American history the only way the enslaved could tell their story was in song, albeit necessary to keep it hidden in plain view for centuries because their lives depended on it. (from Calvin Earl: Ambassador of the American Spirituals).

I'm Gonna Live So God Can Use Me

The text of this Spiritual illustrates that strong communal values were compatible with both old African traditions and the newly forming nation. "I'm gonna live, work, pray and sing so (in a way) that God can use me anywhere, anytime."

"Down by the Riverside" is an African-American spiritual that dates back before the American Civil War and sung by slaves as a work song. Songs were a major part of how geographic information was conveyed for the safe travel of slaves to the north during the times of the Underground Railroad. The reference to the riverside in the song, though originally referring to the River Jordan in the Bible, was believed to be a coded way to refer to the Ohio River, where slaves could find safe passage north. The song also refers to biblical imagery such as baptism (white robe), and Jesus (Prince of Peace) and heaven (road to heaven).
