- L.: Beloved in Christ, as we await the great festival of Christmas, let us prepare ourselves so that we may be shown its true meaning. We will hear in lessons from Holy Scripture how the prophets of Israel foretold that God would visit and redeem us, his waiting people.
- P: Let us rejoice in our carols and hymns that the good purpose of God is being mightily fulfilled.
- L: Let us celebrate the promise that our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, will bring all people and all things into the glory of God's eternal kingdom.
