# **Evangel Hall Christmas Dinner**

Every year the TPC senior youth go to Evangel Hall with some youth leaders and the minister to prepare and serve Christmas dinner to the homeless and underhoused at **Evangel Hall Mission** in Toronto.

# This ministry is only made possible by the generous donations of cash and food by our TPC members.

This year our youth will be serving dinner on **Sunday December 17**.

The need is even greater this year as it is estimated we will need to feed close to **200 people** as opposed to the usual 100.
